

DRUG RELATED ARRESTS

Drug Related Arrests by Drug


The total number of persons of drug related arrests was 45,013 from January to July in 2020. Among them, there were 23,203 (51.55%) persons for heroin related arrests and 20,640 (45.85%) persons for cannabis related arrests. In addition, 969 persons for methamphetamine, 139 persons for psychotropic substances, 49 persons for hashish and 13 persons for cocaine were arrested.

Graph No: 01 - Drug Related Arrests by Drug




Drug Related Arrests by District

By considering the total number of arrests, highest number of drug related arrested persons, 10,330 (22.95%) were reported from Colombo district followed by 16.85 % of arrested persons from Gampaha district, 8.62 % of arrested persons from Kurunegala district and 8.22 % of arrested persons from Kalutara district. Lowest number of drug related arrested persons, 1 (0.002%) were reported from Mulativu district.



Map No: 01 – Drug related arrests by district


Drug Related Arrests by Province

Majority of the drug related arrests, 21,613 (48.02 %), was reported from the Western province followed by 4959 (11.02%) of arrests from Central province and 4237 (9.41%) of arrests from North Western province. Lowest number of drug related arrests, 1259 (2.80%) was reported from North Central Province.




Map No: 02 – Drug related arrests by province

Seized Quantity of Drugs (Kg)

By considering the seized quantity of drugs Island-wide, 1,315.929 kg of heroin and 2,133.902 kg of cannabis were seized from January to July in 2020. In addition, 0.025 kg of cocaine, 2.227 kg of hashish, 856.008 kg of methamphetamine and 2.834 kg of psychotropic substances were seized. Also 4425 of capsule and 20,820 of tablets were seized as psychotropic substances during the considered period.

Graph No: 04 - Seized Quantity of Drugs (Kg)


The government and non-government organizations involved in drug treatment services in Sri Lanka. There were 1044 recorded persons who obtained treatment facilities from January to July in 2020. Among them, majority (99.5%) of persons was male. By considering distribution of district of them, highest number of persons (317) arrived from Gampaha district and next highest number of persons (295) arrived from Colombo district.

By considering the reported data of treatment agencies, 311 (29.8%) of persons were obtained treatment facility from the treatment centers of National Dangerous Drugs Control Board and 127 (12.2%) of persons were obtained treatment from Drug Rehabilitation Programme for prisoners in department of Prisons. Also, 188 (18%) persons from private treatment agencies and 418 (40%) persons from Kandakadu treatment and rehabilitation center of Bureau of the Commissioner General of Rehabilitation (BCGR) were obtained treatment facilities from January to July in 2020.


Graph No: 05 - Reported Drug Dependent persons for Treatment Facilities
