
Drug-Related Arrests by Drug

In 2024, a total of 228,450 individuals were arrested for drug-related offenses across the island. Of these, heroin-related offenses accounted for 75,097 individuals, representing 32.9% of the total. Cannabis-related offenses led to 75,602 arrests, making up 33.1% of the total, indicating its widespread use and cultivation. Methamphetamine-related arrests numbered 68,132, comprising 29.8% of the total, reflecting growing concern over the rise of synthetic drugs. Additionally, 82 individuals were arrested for cocaine-related offenses, and 649 were detained for offenses related to hashish. These statistics underscore the broad spectrum of drug issues facing the region and highlight the extensive efforts by law enforcement to address them.

In 2024, the total number of arrests for drug-related offenses saw a notable increase compared to 2023, marking an emerging trend in the country. This upward trend in drug-related arrests underscores growing concerns about the prevalence of drugs and highlights the efforts of law enforcement authorities to combat drug trafficking and abuse.

Emerging Concern: Rise in Kush-Related Arrests

An emerging trend in 2024 is the increasing number of arrests related to the use and distribution of Kush, a synthetic form of cannabis. A total of 47 individuals were arrested across the country for offenses linked to Kush, reflecting a concerning rise in the presence and circulation of this potent and often unpredictable substance. The relatively recent appearance of Kush in local drug markets signals a shift in substance use patterns, particularly among youth and urban populations.

Unclassified Threats: Increase in Psychotropic Substance Abuse

In addition to the main categories of drugs commonly reported, there is a noticeable and concerning increase in the use of other psychotropic substances across the country. A considerable number of individuals were arrested in 2024 for offenses related to the misuse of controlled medicines and synthetic drugs that fall outside the primary classifications, such as heroin, cannabis, and methamphetamine. These substances include prescription medications like tramadol, diazepam, and other psychotropic pills, as well as emerging synthetic compounds that are not yet fully regulated. Although these cases are not separately categorized in the main statistical tables, field reports and enforcement data indicate a rising trend in their abuse, particularly among young adults and vulnerable populations.

Shifting Trends: Methamphetamine Joins Major Drug Categories

Methamphetamine-related arrests in 2024 have reached levels nearly equal to those of cannabis and heroin, marking a significant shift in the country's drug abuse landscape. While cannabis and heroin have traditionally been the most commonly abused substances, the sharp rise in methamphetamine usage has propelled it into the category of major drug types. With 68,132 arrests linked to methamphetamine, just slightly behind cannabis (75,602) and heroin (75,097), the data reflects a growing trend in the use and trafficking of synthetic stimulants.

According to arrest statistics, the Western Province has the highest prevalence of drug-related incidents in the country. In addition to the Western Province, the Southern and Central Provinces also exhibit high prevalence rates of drug-related activities.

Seized Quantity of Drugs (Kg)

From January to December 2024, law enforcement agencies across the island reported significant seizures of various illicit drugs. A total of 832.360 kilograms of heroin was seized, highlighting the substantial presence and distribution of this narcotic. Cannabis seizures were even more pronounced, with authorities confiscating 8,359.501 kilograms, indicating its widespread cultivation and use. Additionally, 1,364.254 kilograms of methamphetamine were seized during this period, underscoring the growing concern over synthetic drugs in the region. These figures reflect the extensive efforts of law enforcement in combating drug trafficking and abuse.
